## Introduction

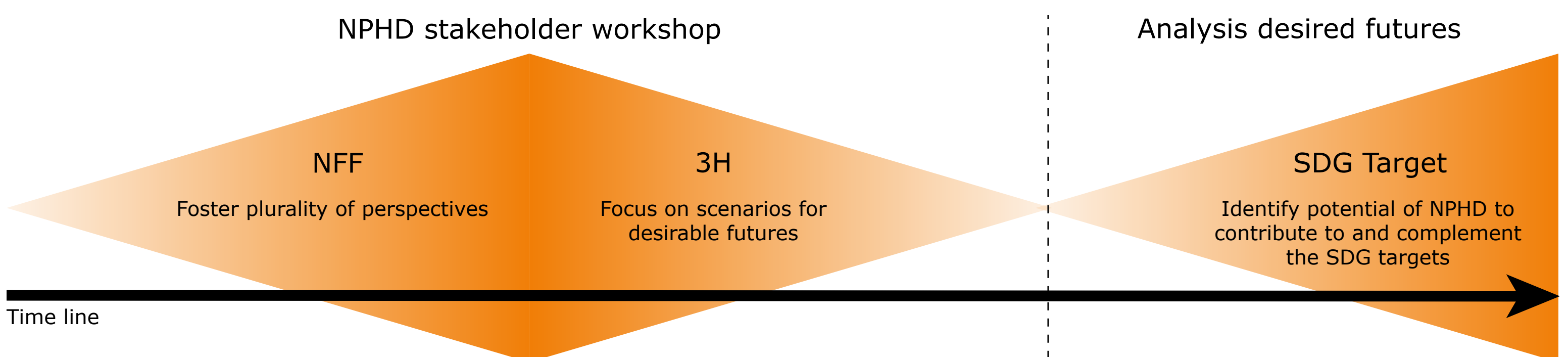
Nationaal Park Hollandse Duinen

National Park Hollandse Duinen (NPHD) is a brand new National Park that aims to be a showcase of how people and nature can co-exist (NPHD, 2017). It covers the entire coastline of the province of Zuid-Holland (the Netherlands), including sea, beaches, dunes, forests, agriculture, urban infrastructure and a million people. Hence, numerous actors, interests and desires are involved in NPHD. A novel participatory scenario process for exploring desirable nature futures was piloted in NPHD (Kuiper et al., in prep.). In this workshop the Nature Futures Framework (NFF) developed for IPBES was applied (Peirera et al., 2020) in combination with the Three Horizons Framework (3H) (Sharpe et al., 2016).

The objective of the workshop was to:

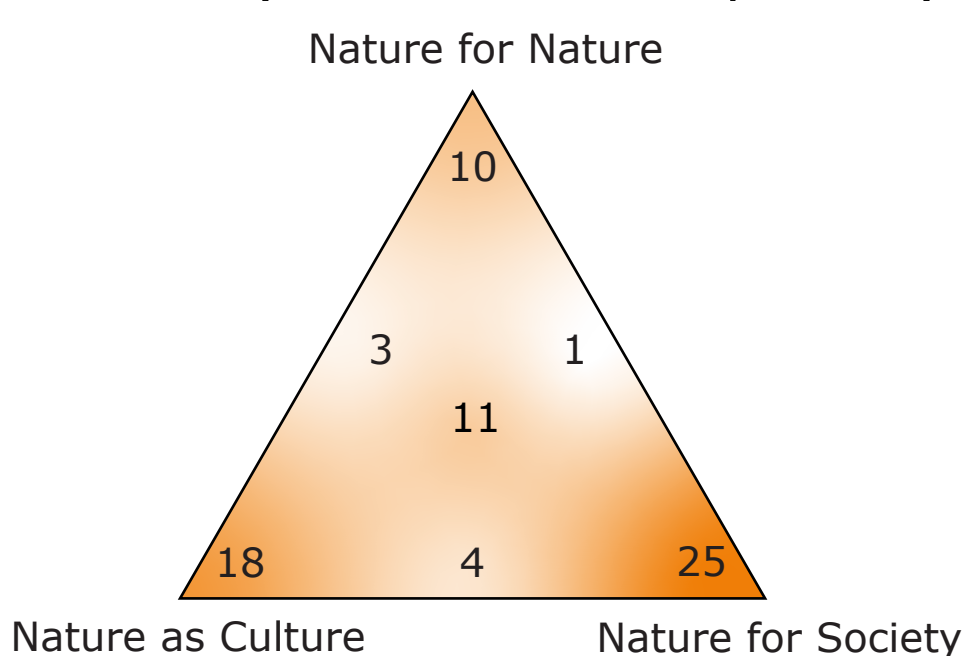
- 1) Operationalize the Nature Futures Framework (NFF) at a regional scale

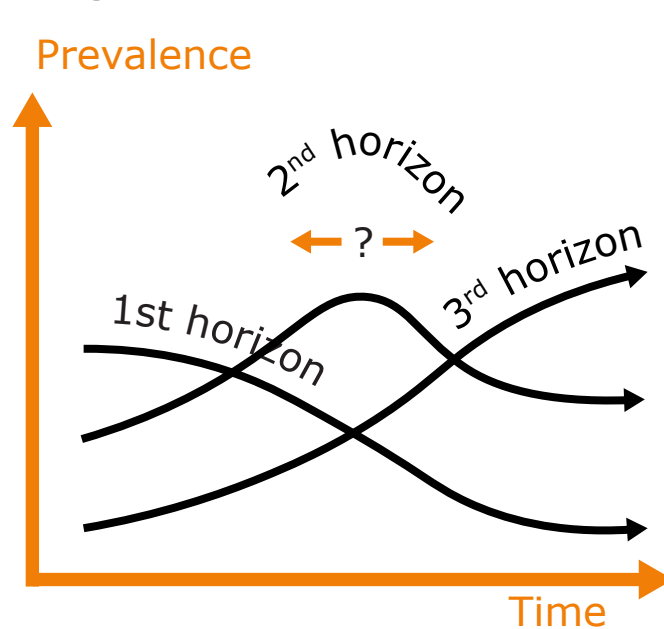


## Results
